The Digitization Project

- ■What?
 - Print collection of North Carolina Supreme Court briefs
 - Documents ranging from 1873-2000
- Why?
 - Requests for access
- ■The Issue
 - Privacy concerns
 - Practical obscurity

Redaction: The Legal Considerations

- Constitutional Law
 - Right to privacy
- Tort Law
 - Four privacy torts: public disclosure of private fact, false light, intrusion upon seclusion, and misappropriation
- Federal Law
 - HIPPA, FERPA, COPPA, Violence Against Women Act
- State Law
 - Public Record Law
 - Social Security number provision
 - Identity Theft Protection Act

Redaction: The Ethical Considerations

- Information protected by laws
 - Personally identifying information
 - Children's names
 - Rape victims' names
- Censorship
- Knowledge & Predictability

Redaction: The Practical Considerations

- Time
 - Slow process
 - No timeline
- Money
- Staff commitment
- Imperfect process
- Paving new territory

The Redaction Decision

- Three options
 - Not digitize
 - Redact
 - Delay
- What to redact?
 - Birth dates
 - Drivers license numbers
 - Social Security numbers
 - Children's names
 - Rape victim names

The Redaction Procedure

Adobe Acrobat Pro XI: Search & Redact

- 1. Conduct search on folder of briefs
- 2. Save excel document of search results
- 3. Open briefs returned in search
- 4. Make a redaction determination
- 5. Redact identified sensitive information
- 6. Record
- 7. Review & Confirmation
